## 1. Connecting Through Communication

- Face-to-Face: Faculty and staff that are happy to assist you in any way possible

#### 3. Student Success

- Reading your schedule
  - MW = Class on Monday and Wednesday
  - TTH = Class on Tuesday and Thursday
  - o M, T, W, TH, or F = Class only meets once a week
  - Building names and room numbers are listed on the schedule next to each class
  - o Academic Advisor's Name is also listed on your schedule.
  - An "E" after the section number indicates that an electronic book is available for the class.
  - o A designation of "VG", VS", etc. indicates that the section is virtual or online.

TIP: Invest in a planner and get organized

- Grade Point Average (GPA)
  - Financial Aid Specifics for maintaining awards. Visit <a href="www.eastms.edu">www.eastms.edu</a> for complete information on all our awards programs.
    - ACT scholarship with score of 20-28 Maintain 2.50 GPA and successfully complete 15 semester hours. Failure to meet requirements will result in probation or suspension.
    - ACT scholarship with score of 29+ Maintain 3.00 GPA and successfully complete 15 semester hours. Failure to meet requirements will result in probation or suspension.
    - √ Valedictorian/Salutatorian scholarship Maintain 3.00 GPA and successfully complete 15 semester hours. Failure to meet requirements will result in probation or suspension.
    - Students who are placed on scholarship probation are given the following semester to revive their GPA and/or maintain the hours requirement before the scholarship is lost. If the GPA and/or hours requirement is not met after one semester the scholarship is completely lost.
    - Tuition Assistance scholarship Maintain 2.50 GPA and successfully complete 15 semester hours. There is no probationary semester for Tuition Guarantee. The scholarship is lost if requirements are not met.
    - Pell Grant, Student Loans, Federal Work-study Progress is checked after the spring term. A 1.50 GPA for freshmen and a 2.00 GPA for sophomores is required. Failure to meet the 2.00 requirement results in suspension. Students can submit a written appeal for a suspension status that is due to extenuating circumstances, such as, illness, death of a relative, etc.
  - O Phi Theta Kappa (3.25) Students who achieve a 3.25 GPA one semester will be invited to join Phi Theta Kappa (PTK). Once a student is inducted, he/she must maintain a 3.25. PTK is an honor that is rewarded in the form of a scholarship at the several Mississippi universities. Please contact the university directly for additional information regarding scholarship amounts.

TIP: Start Strong!

- Absences
  - O Dropped after 5<sup>th</sup> absence for most classes. Career/Technical and Manufacturing programs have their own absence policy.
  - o Three tardies equal 1 absence.
- Withdrawing
  - Withdrawal's and Add/Drops can be initiated in the Counseling Center
    - Add/Drop of a class can be done within a short window at the start of semester classes
    - Withdrawals can effect Financial Aid and also cause accumulation of a bill in the Business office.
    - <sup>™</sup> W = Withdraw without penalty by a certain date

# 5. Taking Care of Business

- o Lion Central
  - Update personal/emergency information to your student record, such as address, personal email address, phone number etc....

- Any transcripts or ACT scores can be submitted
- Transfer transcripts you might have will need to be sent so credits can be transferred in.
   financial aid
- Begin the process of changing a major
- You will apply for EMCC graduation through your LEO portal but any question regarding graduation can be answered in Lion Central
- You can request an EMCC transcript be sent to yourself or another institution at www.getmytranscript.com.
- Everything dealing with Financial Aid (FAFSA, MTAG, Scholarships) all happens in Lion Central.
   A student must maintain full-time status (at least 12 hrs. for federal money; at least 15 hrs. for State Aid & EMCC scholarships)

Tip: Deadlines are important! Pay attention to dates.

#### Business Office

- o Finalize This means all fees are paid and you have received an official copy of your schedule.
- o Decals Decals are \$15.00 and must be placed on the bottom left corner of the back glass.
- Purchase meal plans and make payment on account.
- Parking Students will be issued parking citations for:
  - o Parking in an illegal zone (i.e. faculty/staff lots, grass, handicap lots, and in front of gates)
  - Displaying a decal improperly
  - o Speed limit is 10mph
